





Laying a Better Foundation

The Trustees invite you to join them in a project to update the flooring in the foyer, Fellowship Hall, office hallway, multipurpose room, and sanctuary. Please see the drawing below for more details. We hope to replace the worn and "rippled" flooring with carpet squares plus some vinyl plank flooring outside the bathroom and on the west end of Fellowship Hall.



The cost of the project will be about \$36,000. We are asking people to "buy" carpet by the box or to donate monetarily as their finances allow. Each box "costs" \$475

and that includes the removal and disposal of the old carpet or vinyl, the removal of the old glue, the removal and reinstallation of the baseboards, and the installation of the new flooring.

Advent 2025 at Grace

After All Saints' Day on November 2 we will begin an extended Advent. We begin the season with a three week series titled "The Days Are Surely Coming." We look ahead by returning to the promises of God —



the promise of a new reality, a new hope, and an ongoing presence that will usher all of creation into this new kingdom and kin-dom of relationship and joy. Though this series is grounded in the Hebrew scripture lectionary texts, Christ is the center of our worship and the ground of our hope. These first weeks of Advent remind that the days are surely coming when every knee shall bow and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord.



Part 2 of Advent leans into the season as an active and watchful waiting. Doing so, we tap into the world's longing for redemption, salvation, and transformation. The beautiful hymn "Toda la Tierra," #210 in the United Methodist Hymnal, is a reminder of

what is at stake. "All the world, bound and struggling, seeks true liberty" in the first verse allows us to look back to the story of the Incarnation and to look forward to the coming of the kingdom of heaven, when the will of God will be done on earth as in heaven. All of creation is waiting for this fulfillment. In worship, we can see the signs of the nearness of Emmanuel, God with us.
