Advent Candle Lighting:

He is out in the wilderness, baptizing, receiving confession, preaching about the one to come, changing hearts. All of this was to prepare people to receive the good news of Jesus Christ. John's limitations — living in the wilderness, living simply — were part of what drew people out to see him. We too are called to be people who prepare people to receive Christ.
