





JUNE 17, 2025

Present: Pastor John, Prairey Walkling (Chair), Matt Pfister (Staff Pastor Parish), Kelly Kruger (Finance), Lavincia Pfister (Youth), Susan Bass, Tom Stevens (Kitchen), and Phyllis Stevens (Recording Secretary).

Meeting was called to order at 7:08 pm by Prairey. Pastor John shared a devotion based on Genesis 49:25, a scripture on blessings, followed by prayer.

The minutes for April were distributed and following some typo corrections Tom made a motion to approve them which was seconded by Kelly Kruger. Passed unanimously.

FINANCE – Kelly gave a report on the financial status of the church and noted which funds were currently a concern because of their negative status. Those are the Discretionary Fund, Special Project Fund, Youth Fund, and the Mission Fund. Overall, our finances ae in the negative. She believes it is not an expense issue but rather a revenue issue. There was discussion on how that issue can be solved and ideas were offered. Pastor John offered to go to ¾ time to save on the payroll but the group was not in favor of that solution at all. More ideas will come and hopefully our giving will increase as snowbirds return to the area.




PVCC — Piedmont Valley Community Church!
